Donations 2020

As you may be aware all schools are no longer allowed to ask for money for camps, swimming, etc. if those events are part of the curriculum. Optional things like a ski camp or optional sports events schools can charge for. **All decile 1-7 schools** across the country have been given \$150 per student to cover the cost of school trips and camps. Decile 8-10 schools have not been given any money and are not allowed to charge for trips/camps. We are a **decile 9 school**, the only one in Rotorua city. As a result Lynmore is the only school not being given the \$150 per student by the government.

We would love to be able to run school trips this year again but are reliant on 2 things:
Parents paying the school donation of \$150 for the first child and \$75 for subsequent children. This is a voluntary donation to support outdoor activities and trips in 2020.

If there are parents/friends in the community who can offer ideas/support for outdoor visits, eg farm visits, tourist attraction visits, lake/river trips, forest and environmental trips, tramping and camping. If you have any contacts or resources you could offer to support education outside the classroom we'd love to hear from you. Many thanks!

Kia ora whanau

This week we had Room 2 and Room 3 out doing Waka Ama at Lake Okareka. The conditions on Monday were not that favourable, with southerly winds and an incoming tide, which caused the water to have white caps and lots of swell as the water hit the shoreline. Despite the conditions, Room 2 had an awesome day paddling and managed to find calmer waters at Acacia Bay where the group enjoyed a swim jumping off a small pontoon and also doing bombs off the side of the waka. Tuesday however, gave us a totally different day with very little wind awesome sunshine and the lake looking like glass. Room 3 also had a very enjoyable day and they too were able to have a swim and jump off the waka. Whilst out on the lake, we had Otonga School accompany us and they were very kind in allowing us to utilise their support boat that followed both schools around the lake to ensure everyone was safe. We had approximately 70 people out on the lake including parents, teachers and family support.



Capsizing is something in the Waka Ama world we try and avoid unless demonstrating safety and in the event of one happening being able to get back into the canoe quickly and safely and continuing to paddle. Well, Room 3 experienced this first hand and did very well to stay calm and composed and came out laughing asking "Can we do that again". Matua Tangaroa took 5 other students out on the W6 (6 seated canoe) and for one split second everyone happened to be paddling on the right side which caused the canoe to flip. With quick thinking of staff and the support of Otonga School, our students were back in the canoe without fuss and paddling in no time. Whaea Liz, Matua Tangaroa and Maylene of Te Aurere Waka Ama club and our parents displayed great team work. Otonga School were amazed and gave high praise for our students who remained calm throughout and continued on with no fuss. Ka pai Team Lynmore!

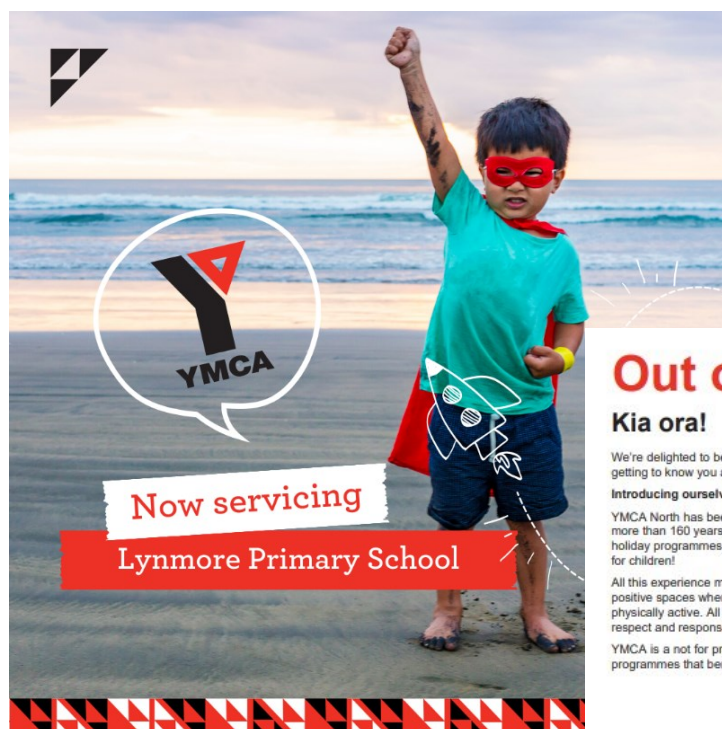
