FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

I hope you are managing to stay calm and well at this challenging time for our country. We are doing our best to keep everyone's spirits up and to carry on as normal in spite of the huge media attention. We will get through this it is just going to be a tricky few months ahead for everyone in the country.

We are running normal classroom programmes and are reminding children to wash their hands properly during the day. Our cleaners are aware of the need for cleanliness in our bathrooms and classrooms. Hang on in there, we know things are stressful for many families. If you need support or you feel your child needs support with your wellbeing please do feel like you can reach out to us and ask for help. We have lots of connections with various agencies that we can connect you up with. Don't feel alone and don't bottle up how you are feeling, we are here if you need us. Please talk /email at anytime.

Possible school closures

Currently schools are open across NZ. PLEASE do not send your children to school if they have a cough or cold. The Education Minister has stated that schools are still the safest places for children to be, and we do agree with this however, it is a high risk environment for our teachers, teacher aides and office staff and we would appreciate your support in keeping our staff safe and well.

Please be aware that if you have recently arrived from overseas or are in a home with someone who has arrived back from overseas we do want you to consider self-isolation for your children to assist us in keeping everyone well.

Preparation for home based distance learning

We are well prepared for being able to deliver daily lessons online in the event of a school closure. Please read the article below which outlines how we will run things. Your child's teacher will be available online during normal school time and will be running lessons via Zoom <https://zoom.us/>.

We will have a help booklet going home and help videos available to show you how to use the technology. Children will begin using Zoom at school this week so that they are familiar with how to log on etc.

You will have seen a survey come home to find out if families have the technology to carry on learning online, please complete the survey as soon as you can and return it to school.

We have also been in contact with **Harvey Norman, Rotorua** who have been very supportive and have some offers on tablets which can be used for online distance learning (see advert).

Blended Distance Learning Position Statement 2020

Tuesday 17th March 2020

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

In the light of the possible closure of NZ Schools and thinking forward to the provision of high quality lessons for students.

Education is an integral cog of society and it always will be. Over the past 20 years there has been a call to better prepare our students for the ever-changing-world. Whilst there has been shifts and agreement on this, teaching and learning has largely remained status-quo. With this current pandemic there is a need but also more importantly an opportunity to shift what we do as educators to provide rich and meaningful teaching and learning. This is something we can work on and build on as time progresses but it is not limited to full school closure. Using and moving more towards a flipped/blended learning environment will enrich what is already available for students who are currently present everyday. It will also provide more equity of access to education for those who are currently in isolation, or who are often away sick. Furthermore it will build our digital fluency and competence as we explore what learning can look like in the future and how these tools can support a blended approach. In essence teaching and learning remains the same - it is the mechanisms that we use to provide the learning opportunities that will be different.

Below is some guidance around the changes that we may encounter over the coming weeks IF we are forced to close or we have a high number of students away.

Why distant learning (both on and offline (unplugged)) as an option?

- To provide high quality learning opportunities anywhere anytime.
- To provide a sense of normality for our students
- Because the current health situation may prevent schools opening face to face
- An opportunity to develop a blended approach for the longer term
- To provide greater student self direction (agency)
- An opportunity to build teacher, student and whanau competencies

How will we deliver distance learning?

- Provide a range of options, both digital and unplugged (offline)
- Provide a handout/booklet with learning opportunities and access details for whanau
- Use [Zoom](#) meeting software to connect teachers with other teachers; teachers with students; and teachers with whanau
- Use [Screen Cast-O-matic](#) for teachers to create learning videos for sharing with students
- Use Seesaw to share learning from home and for teachers/whanau provide feedback about students' learning

What will we deliver?

- The ability for students to learn online without attending school
- The ability for teachers to connect with students in realtime
- Weekly Principal Awards celebrations online with Mrs Taylor (Principal)
- A multimedia approach to learning

Music & Movement

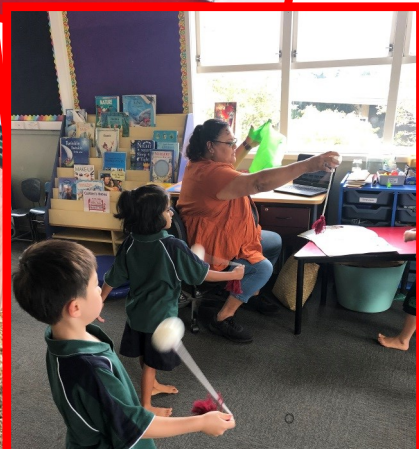

PEP (Personalised Education Plans)

Thank you to those parents who have already come in and met with teachers to co construct a P.E.P (Personalised Education Plans) with your child and their teacher. The focus of the P.E.P will be around the building of learning behaviours and key competencies (Relating to Others, Participating and Contributing, Managing Self, Thinking, Using language, Symbol and Text) in context and in some cases in core subject areas. The aim of the key competencies in combination, is to give young people the skills to learn anywhere any time. They should underpin all the teaching and learning. It is no longer sufficient for students to merely acquire knowledge and master skills. While reading, writing and mathematics will not be the main focus, these along with other curriculum areas might be part of the discussion. Of course if there is anything specifically that you would like to discuss with the teachers, please let them know.

We highly encourage you to touch base with your child's teacher when the need arises however, we realize that some of you may not have been able to do this as of yet. As a result we have some available P.E.P meeting times that you may like to utilize. If you feel that you need more than the 15 minute time slot during the P.E.P meeting, please arrange an alternative meeting with your child's teacher.

Please follow the instructions below to book your meeting time. If you are unable to make any of these times, please contact your child's teacher to arrange another meeting.

Instructions:

- Go to the website www.schoolinterviews.co.nz/ and enter the code **cfdxz** in the 'School event Code'.
- Enter your full name, email address, and choose how many students you are booking for and enter their names then click 'Go'.
- Choose your child's teacher/s and click 'Go'.
- Click the square on the date and time/s you would like and then click 'Go'.
- Finished! Your booking will be listed on the screen and also emailed to your email address. You can print your bookings at this stage.
- At any time you can re-enter and change or cancel your bookings.
- If you run into any difficulties, please see the office or your child's teacher.

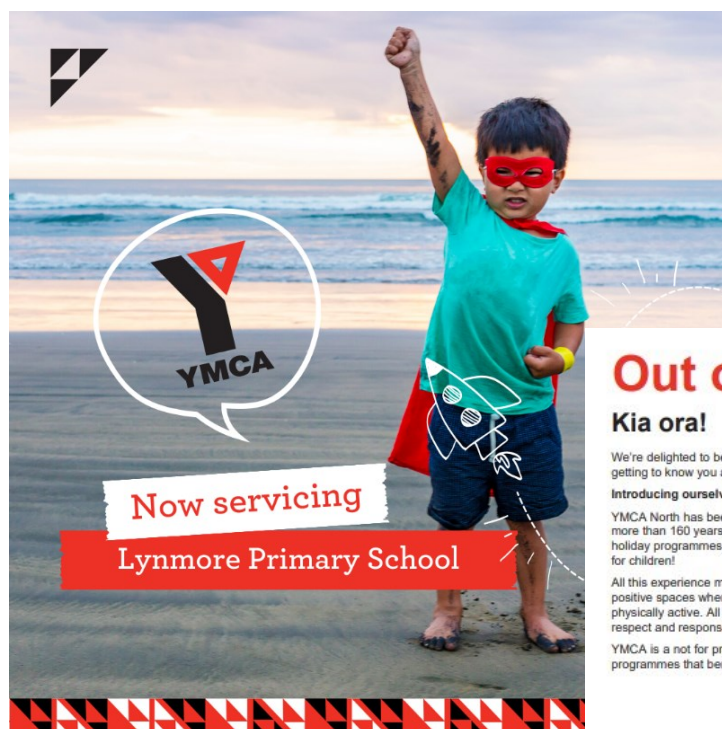
