## FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

### Auditory and Visual Processing Presentation Thanks

A huge thank you to the large number of parents that attended the workshop on Tuesday evening. It was fantastic to have you there to be able to show you what we are trying to do to really uncover ANY barriers or differences students might have in learning. It is a new piece of work for us and very few schools across the country are actively working on this for us to get any support. Our biggest challenge will be accessing funding to support students with whatever equipment, programme or advanced screening they need. We do think this is essential though, we also believe there is enough money currently in the Education budget to be able to provide specialised services to students, much of the current money allocated to education appears from our point of view to go on areas that make little to no impact on students achievement, progress and wellbeing. Teachers and students in the classrooms feel very much at the bottom of the chain in terms of financial input from the Education portfolio. We would really appreciate your support at this time in talking with politician's seeking election at this time, we have the golden opportunity to make a case for more support in schools for programmes like Alpha to Omega and ICept screening and support for Dyslexia, Irlens and other learning differences. It will be a long journey to get everything in place but ensuring we have a tailored programme in place for all students, embracing their differences is the goal.

### New Build Commencement

We are getting closer to the commencement of the building project for new classrooms. Work should commence in the middle of Term 4.

### Care on the Crossing

Yesterday at around 3.20pm a student in a Lynmore school uniform (approx. 7-8 years old) ran out across the road in front of a car. They had to brake to let her cross safely. She was crossing on the lake side of the school entrance, close to Owhatiura Drive. It was very scary for the driver and could have resulted in a serious accident.

**Please remind your children to always use the crossing and wait for the crossing sign to appear on the lights.**

### Playground Update

The middle school playground has to be removed for the new classroom block to be built. It is hard for us to relocate the playground at the moment whilst there is so much work happening on the site. We would also like to replace it with a more purpose built adventure playground to work in with a more kinesthetic and creative approach. We have donated the existing playground to the Kaingaroa Village community and school as they currently don't have a playground at all for their children. We are happy we are able to offer some support to another community.

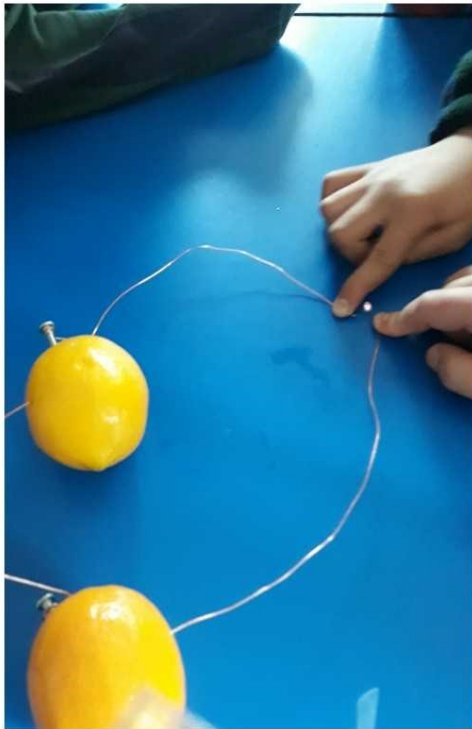

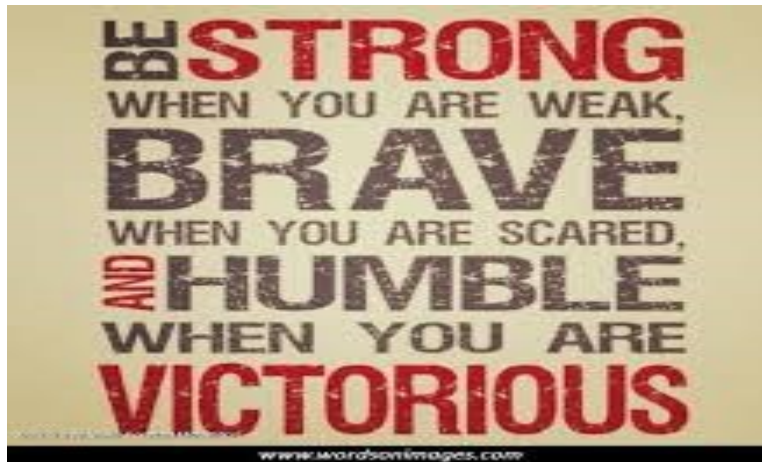

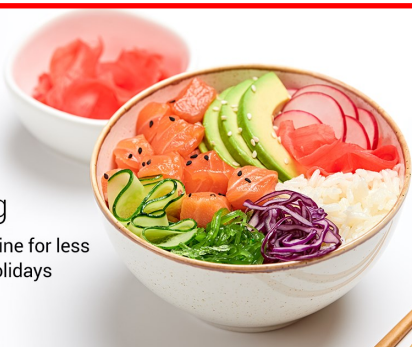
