FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

Community Assembly this week (Friday 2pm - 3 pm):

Is going ahead but with reduced numbers in the hall. We have no class item on the stage this week but Principals awards will go ahead as normal.

The junior school students plus the principal award recipients are the only students who will be physically present in the school hall on Friday. Parents of children receiving awards are welcome to attend in person. Note: the restrictions on social gatherings at level 2 do not apply to schools (bizarre, but true), we do have hand sanitiser available at the door to the hall.

Astroturf and New Fencing:

We are very fortunate to have new funding for new astroturf to be installed over the next term break. We are also aware we need to replace the fencing around the turf but at this stage can't afford it. We need to raise \$54k to replace the fencing and **have had a fantastic idea put forward on how we might be able to raise the money for new fencing.** We are going to be open to sponsoring sections of the fencing e.g. you will be able to buy space on the perimeter fence to advertise your business. The fence is likely to stay there for 15 - 20 years so it will be a great advertising opportunity. The current Astroturf advert by the side of Te Ngae road has been there for 18 years - not a bad return for the cost of a sign. There will be a separate notice coming out on how you can buy a space on the brand new fence next to the brand new astrotuf. Thanks again for all the amazing suggestions

School Donations - THANK YOU!!!!!!

Thank you so much to everyone who has paid their school donation or paid even some of it - YOU ARE AMAZING! We do know how tough things are out there, we have only a couple of international fee paying students and aren't eligible for the governments school donations scheme either so we are struggling financially this year and into next year to provide all the usual services and programmes.

Uniform Reminder:

Please let us know if you are having trouble getting any school uniform items. It is important that children wear the uniform each day. We have relaxed some of the uniform rules and are allowing pants / skirts which the children occasionally wear to be any brand as long as are they are in the Lynmore navy blue.

We also have some shirts at the office which can be purchased for \$15 and your child can wear their coloured whanau/house group top. We are increasingly seeing children in multi-coloured sweatshirts and other items which are not school uniform. We do understand that occasionally uniform gets muddy or wet and you have to substitute it, we are perfectly OK with this on the odd occasion, please do See Saw message the teacher so that they are aware.

Face Masks:

Children are welcome to wear face masks to school however we know a few are feeling embarrassed etc. As this pandemic is now looking likely to run into 2021 we are currently having some fabulous school face masks made with the logo on which we will have available for you to buy soon.

The purpose is to 'normalise' face masks when children have a sniffle where possible and having school ones available may help children feel it is a more normal thing to do. We are not selling these as a profit making initiative, just to help with another health drive to keep us all well.



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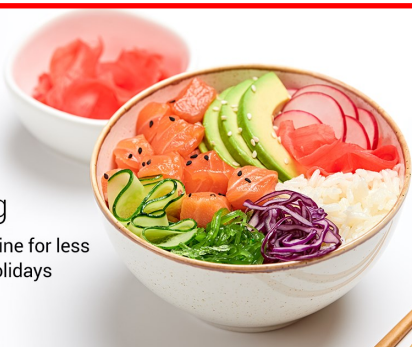

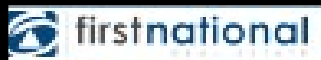
