

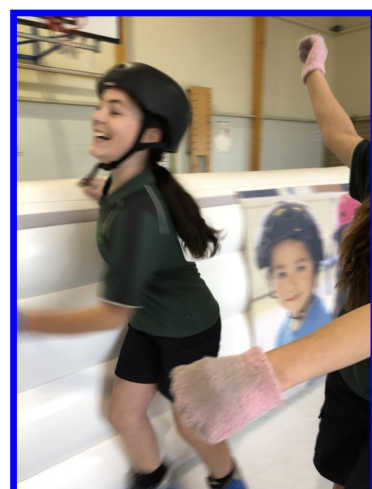

FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

New Fencing Advertising Opportunity:

We are putting new fencing around the new astroturf, but this is expensive. To offset the costs we are offering the opportunity for you to buy advertising space along the Iles Road and Te Ngae Road facing fences. See the attached advert for the costs etc. We have already sold quite a few signs so please get in quick if you want to grab a space for the next 2 years.

Face Masks:

Children are welcome to wear face masks to school however we know a few are feeling embarrassed etc. As this pandemic is now looking likely to run into 2021 we are currently having some fabulous school face masks made with the logo on which we have high quality school uniform. *Lynmore masks available for you to buy from the office at \$10.00 per mask.*

The purpose is to 'normalise' face masks when children have a sniffle where possible and having school ones available may help children feel it is a more normal thing to do. We are not selling these as a profit making initiative, just to help with another health drive to keep us all well.

Te Ngae Road Upgrade Meeting: Downer Group:

At the end of September work will be starting on the upgrade of the Tarawera Road intersection, as part of the Eastern Corridor Stage One Project. They are removing the existing roundabout at the intersection, and constructing a signalised intersection. At the same time they will upgrade services in the area, including underground powerlines. This is a significant piece of work. For this reason they are holding two information sessions for businesses and stakeholders so you can learn more about what you can expect to see and experience over the next nine months as we complete this work.

You are invited you to attend one of these information sessions next Monday, 14 September at Lynmore Primary School Hall (located on Iles Road; map below). The two sessions are 12pm-1.30pm and 5pm-6.30pm and are drop-in sessions so feel free to come at any time. They'll have maps and information for you, as well as members of our team who can answer any questions.

Representatives from Waka Kotahi (NZTA) WSP and Downer will be in attendance to cover all aspects of the work being undertaken.

Sponsor the Fence

We are replacing the sports surface (AstroTurf) and the surrounding fencing, both are over 20 years old.

The combined cost of replacement of both is around \$170k.



We need to raise around \$55k to enable us to complete the entire project including:

- Removing some of the trees that drop leaves onto the AstroTurf alongside Te Ngae Road.
- Replacing the fence

Once the new fencing is in place and some of the obscuring trees removed the two sides marked below have a great advertising opportunity along Te Ngae Road and Iles Road.

We are therefore selling the option of an advertising space along the new fencing around the AstroTurf.

Costs for advertising signage for a 2 year timeframe are as follows:

Te Ngae Road side:

Per 1 metre advertising space

Iles Road side:

Per 1 metre advertising space

- Spaces are limited to a first in first served basis.
- Only one advert per field of business will be taken e.g. one real estate, one plumber, etc.
- Timeslot is for 2 years and then the signage will be taken down and replaced with new purchases
- You can purchase more than 1 x metre space for your advert.
- The school will produce the sign based on the graphics and words you send to us.

Iles Road – 5 x advertising spaces available @ \$1,500 plus GST each
