A visit from the What Now team

We were excited to have the children's TV show "What Now" filming with the Catfish pest team today around the Okere Falls area. We will let you know when the show is being broadcast on TV.

New school class structure from 2021

We have been working on a new way of structuring classes, year groups and teams from next year to allow for maximum flexibility and choice for parents and to be able to better tailor the class placement to your child's specific needs.

We are running an information session on **Tuesday, 3rd November in Room 8 from 3.15 pm** for all who want to hear more about the class placement options for 2021.

Walking/Wheels Wednesdays – Term 4

From next term we will be **closing the drop off zone EVERY WEDNESDAY from next week (Week 3)** and running a walking and wheels to school day. We are trying to encourage more children to walk and ride to school where they can. The congestion outside the school, particularly at the end of the day is becoming dangerous. We are working closely with the District Council, NZTA and the Police to come up with some safe alternatives for children and parents.

We will be as part of this work developing 3 to 4 new walking routes from 3 key starting points in the community. This was based on the feedback from the community survey in Term 1 this year which asked residents to identify safe and not so safe areas for walking and cycling.



Ruru the Road Safety Owl will be visiting us and you will begin to see painted footprints appear on the pavement to show students which route to follow to get to school.

Changes to Te Ngae Road have the potential to increase traffic past the school hence our working closely with the District Council and police to find some safe solutions.

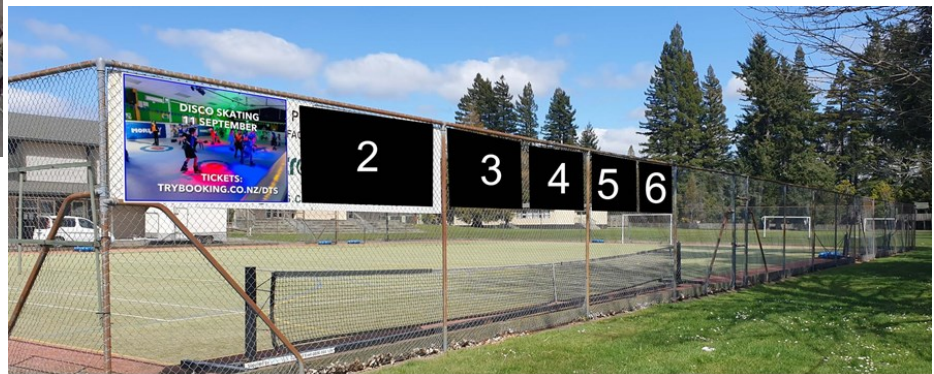
Sponsor the Fence - Update

We are replacing the sports surface (AstroTurf) and the surrounding fencing, both are over 20 years old. The combined cost of replacement of both is around \$170k.

We need to raise around \$55k to enable us to complete the entire project including:

- Removing some of the trees that drop leaves onto the AstroTurf along side Te Ngae Road.
- Replacing the fence

Once the new fencing is in place and some of the obscuring trees removed the two sides marked below have a great advertising opportunity along Te Ngae Road and Iles Road. We are therefore selling the option of an advertising space along the new fencing around the AstroTurf.



Costs for advertising signage for a 2 year timeframe are as follows:

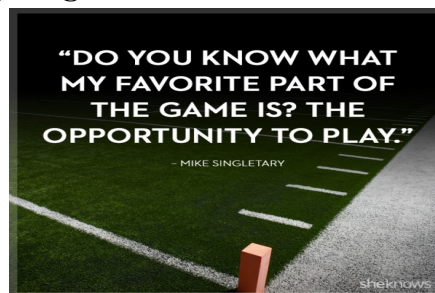

GOALS TO ACHIEVE AT EACH STAGE

Just a reminder that these are the goals that your child is striving to achieve:

Stage	Goal
Pre-School A	Submerge, float and glide
Pre-School B	Propulsive kick with control
1	Submerge, float and glide
2	Propulsive kick with control
3	Propulsive arm strokes with control
4	Correct breathing patterns with control
5	Swimming all 4 strokes with lightness and rhythm
6	Swimming all 4 strokes further with lightness and rhythm

Once Stage 6 has been achieved, then we will discuss with you your options for the next Stage.

Although everyone develops and improves at different speeds (a lot depends on attendance, concentration and effort), we want to make sure that everyone improves. If you feel that your child needs more help or may-be a private lesson to get them going a bit more, then please contact us via email.

HOW TO MAKE REALLY GOOD PROGRESS – please share this with your child(ren)

- J Attend your lesson every week
- J Do your best in the pool
- J Work with your swim teacher – look, listen and have a go
- J Swim (or kick or glide) right on the top of the water like a boat
- J Develop a feel for the water (use your hands and feet) and work out what works well and what does not
- J Volunteer to do demonstrations and show off your favourite swimming activity
- J Swim with Mum and Dad and show them what you have been practicing

WATCHING YOUR CHILD SWIMMING

A lot of you come in and watch your child swimming which is great. If you don't come in, then please come in and have a look. It gives your child the opportunity to show off their skills and for you to see how we operate. It also gives you the opportunity to introduce yourself to the swim teachers, and to ask any questions you may have. Visual feedback is a great way to learn so check out pics in the future on our Facebook page J

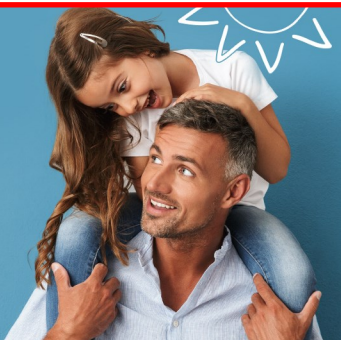

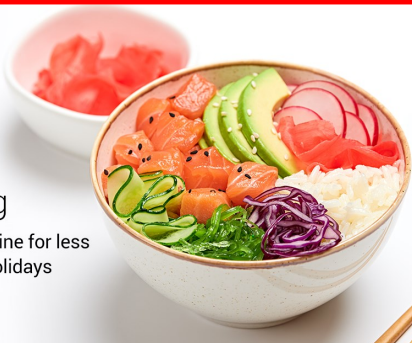
