WELL DONE TO OUR BIOSECURITY TEAM IN WELLINGTON!

Student-led initiatives have been at the heart of Lynmore Primary School biosecurity activities. Their predator trapping journey started five years ago when a parent of a child offered them a DOC200 trap to catch rats in the school's native bush area. Five years on from setting this one trap, they have built and given out over 100 traps to people in their local community; handed out over 100 traps to the Whakarewarewa Pest Free group; provided and helped maintain traplines on Mokoia Island bird sanctuary; and they themselves maintain two traplines in Whakarewarewa Forest and a trapline in their school grounds.

They also work closely alongside William Anaru of Te Arawa Lakes Trust on catfishing projects in Lake Rotorua and Lake Rotoiti and have netted and removed hundreds of catfish from these lakes. A large number of students at the school have had the opportunity to go to these roto and see the native fish and kōura that are being affected by these pest fish, creating some lifelong hunga tiaki.

They have also removed invasive plants from the native bush and planted native species with the support of Tatau Pounamu, Rotorua Tree Trust and Bay of Plenty Regional Council.

Our team had an awesome time in Wellington at the National Biosecurity Awards Ceremony held at Parliament House (*we were one of the three schools that were selected!*) and although unplaced we are super proud of them! Thank you to Mrs G and Mr Doyle for their outstanding drive of this team, along with Sarah Painter, Mr Cunliffe and Mrs Taylor; also all the parents who have supported these children over the time.

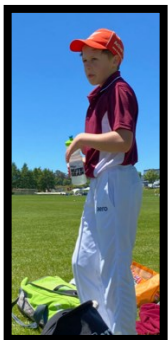
Signing in at school:

Owhatiura community collaborates on first Innovating Streets project for Rotorua

Te Manawa ō Owhatiura is a collaborative Eastside project to trial more child-friendly streets that allow tamariki to move safely around the community.

The project's working group is made up of students and staff from Lynmore School, members of Tatau Pounamu, NZ Police, Rotorua Cycling Action Group and Rotorua Lakes Council.

Working group members and Lynmore Primary School students Phoenix Kautai and Ellie Smith are proud to be part of the project to help others get to school and around the neighbourhood safely.

Phoenix says "Getting to school can be a hassle because it is not always easy for us... Sometimes I have to go around cars." Ellie agrees, and says "You can get used to going to school in the car, but I have more fun on my bike... If it is safer, more kids can go on their bikes."

The project will trial changing the way people in cars, and people walking or biking use Larcy Road, Owhatiura Drive and Iles Road. For example, it could explore if having more room to ride will make it safer for those with accessibility needs or young families on bikes, and if tamariki interacting with elements of play in the design will better enjoy their journey to school.

The working group will be seeking input on the design from local residents and businesses, Lynmore School whānau, as well as the accessibility community.

Lynmore Primary School's Principal Lorraine Taylor explains that it is not just the students who are set to benefit from the Te Manawa ō Owhatiura trial project.

"Working collaboratively with other local community groups means that we get to take a wider point of view, and share the benefits."

"When tamariki are given the chance to enjoy their journey to school, they arrive primed for learning. When their families feel safe about them biking or walking to school, the students gain more independence and confidence to achieve. And we can help them to do this by making our streets more than just a road for cars."

The design could trial extending the space for walking and biking onto the road; using objects such as planter boxes for separation from cars; or painting interactive pictures and games on pathways to add vibrancy and interaction. The advantage of the design being adjustable is that the layout can evolve based on feedback from the community.

Locals will be able to suggest any further additions or changes once they've experienced them on the ground through surveys and interviews. Any successful parts of the design could be made permanent, or be explored in other areas of Rotorua. To see if the changes to the streets will encourage more people to bike or walk through the area, for short journeys, data such as traffic counts, numbers of people walking and biking, and surveys about user enjoyment, will be collected throughout the pilot and compared with information collected before the Te Manawa ō Owhatiura trial began.

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency is subsidising 90% of the \$100,000 project through the "Innovating Streets for People fund", with RLC funding the remaining 10%.

In March 2021, the Te Manawa ō Owhatiura trial will go live for around 6 months. The community will be able to share feedback throughout the entire life of the trial project. The working group will monitor how different elements of the project helps locals to enjoy and interact with the space.

There are a range of Innovating Streets for People projects happening all over Aotearoa, but Te Manawa ō Owhatiura will be the first of its kind in Rotorua.

Learnings from the trial will help to inform any future Innovating Streets for People projects in other local communities.

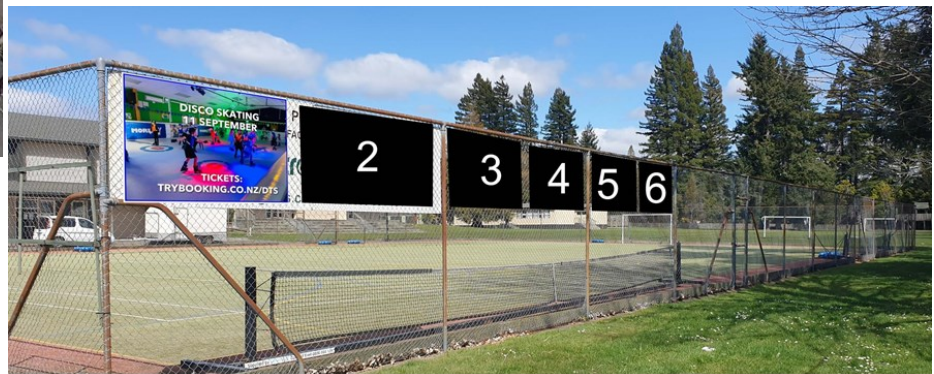
Sponsor the Fence - Update

We are replacing the sports surface (AstroTurf) and the surrounding fencing, both are over 20 years old. The combined cost of replacement of both is around \$170k.

We need to raise around \$55k to enable us to complete the entire project including:

- Removing some of the trees that drop leaves onto the AstroTurf along side Te Ngae Road.
- Replacing the fence

Once the new fencing is in place and some of the obscuring trees removed the two sides marked below have a great advertising opportunity along Te Ngae Road and Iles Road. We are therefore selling the option of an advertising space along the new fencing around the AstroTurf.

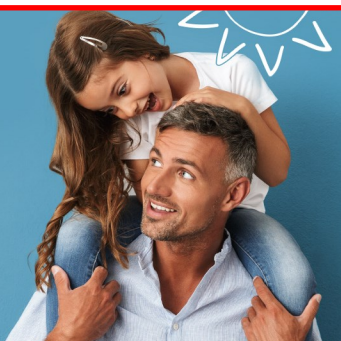

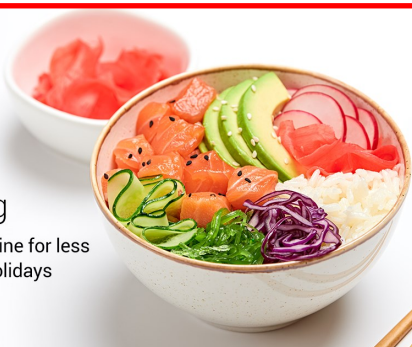
