Perimeter Fencing

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

<u>International Chinese Students - Short term travel programme</u>

We are pleased to be working in partnership with Silver Fern Excellence Initiative (SFEI) to foster a cultural and educational exchange between Chinese and New Zealand students.

"The SFEI short-term travel program endeavors to enhance cultural understanding between China and New Zealand, broaden the global perspectives of both Chinese and New Zealand students, and provide them with enriching experiences in New Zealand's diverse culture, natural beauty, and unique attractions. By partnering with Schools in Rotorua, we aim to offer an immersive program that will cultivate a lasting appreciation for New Zealand among Chinese students, encouraging them to consider further education opportunities in the country."

Near the end of July our school will be hosting our first group of up to 30 students (appx 12 years old) from China for 9 nights and 1 week at our school.

Homestay Guidelines:

- Each homestay can accommodate 1-4 students, with each bedroom accommodating 2 students of the same gender. Female students will not be placed in households with single male occupants. Homestays will provide three meals and transportation to and from school.
- Basic Accommodation Conditions: Each student will have an individual bed with clean bedding, a warm and clean living environment, free Wi-Fi access, and complimentary laundry facilities.
- Homestay families will be responsible for ensuring the safety of students during their stay.
- Catering to students' dietary needs, including preventing food allergies.
- Organize EOTC activities for students during their time at the school and ensure their safety.
- Homestay payment: \$60 per day per student
- Consent to a NZ Police Vet.

At this stage we are looking for expressions of interest to be a Homestay whanau. If you have the capability of hosting 1-4 homestay students please email me on: homestay@lynmore.school.nz

In late May I will be traveling to China with a NZ Principal's group to meet with our Sister School's who will be our partners in this project.

BOP PRIMARY SCHOOLS CLIMBING COMPETITION

Tuesday 14th May, 2024

Venue: Rocktopia, 9 Triton Ave, Mount Maunganui This is a fun, semi competitive climbing competition. You do not need to be an experienced climber.

DISCIPLINES

Each child competes in 3 disciplines:

1/ Top Rope - 3 climbs, one attempt at each climb, 3 min per attempt.

2/ Speed Climb - two attempts - combined overall time.

3/ Bouldering - 2 boulder problems - 3 minute per problem, 3 min break between problems.

PRACTICE SESSION

We will have two practice sessions ahead of the competition at the local climbing wall to learn about the different climbing disciplines:

Thursday 2nd May and Thursday 9th May, departing school at 1.15pm and return at approximately 2.45pm

COST

Competition: \$25.00 per competitor (plus \$5 cash on the day for shoe hire if required) Practice sessions: \$13 per session

TRANSPORT

Private car transport will be needed for both the competition and the practice. Please indicate if you are available. The competition day will be a full day, departing before school starts and returning at approximately 3:30pm. These times will be confirmed once we know the final details for the day.


