We went catfishing at Lake Rotoiti for the first time this year.



TE PĀNUI O TE POARI / THE BOARD NOTICES

Kia ora e te whānau,

Welcome to another full-on year at Lynmore School! Our Board had our first hui of the year on Monday night. We were lucky enough to have some potential new logo and brand designs presented to us. These designs are the result of many discussions between our Principal Whaea Hinei and the Senior Leadership Team who are jumping on the opportunity to update our identity as our uniform contract is coming to an end this year. We will give our feedback on the designs and then seek opinions from our community as we work towards identifying what makes Lynmore School unique and how we want our tamariki to feel during their time at our kura and long after they have departed. It's not just about the uniform, though that is definitely important, it's about how we want our space to feel and what values we want to portray. Watch this space!

In some less exciting news, due to some administrative changes at the Ministry of Education, the timeline for our Gym refurbishment has been further delayed. Another assessment is happening this week and then we will hopefully have a better idea of when the remedial work will start. We know the refurbishment will create disruption for our tamariki and for the community groups who hire this space. Rest assured, Whaea Hinei will update as soon as she knows more.

You may remember that this year is a school Board election year, and this will happen later in the year. If you are interested in school governance and have the time to dedicate to the school, you may consider putting your name forward. The Board is responsible for overseeing property, budget, health & safety and policy as well as supporting the school management to do what they do best - educating our tamariki. It does require a time commitment, especially if you are on a sub-committee, however, getting involved in a school is incredibly rewarding. There is lots of free training if you have the time and interest but not the experience. If governance doesn't excite you, the PTA is always looking for extra support. There are many ways to get involved in our school and we welcome all our whānau.



Kia ora, my name is Mandy and I am the Public Health Nurse (PHN) for the Eastside school in Rotorua including yours.

Public Health Nurses are employed by National Public Health and are assigned primary and intermediate schools where we work closely with the teachers and staff.

We are available to support children, young people and their families with wellbeing and health issues and can also provide health information and advice. We work closely with schools as well as visiting whānau in their homes for follow up and helping them access the support they need.

We are also involved in health promotion such as; School Based Vaccinations, assisting Vision and Hearing Screeners, and following up on hard to obtain permission forms for medical or dental treatments.
