I hope you have had a fantastic week with your children - I know we have. Here are a few things that our kids have been involved in.

Authentic Learning Experiences in Our Local Environment Our teachers continue to find exciting ways to create authentic learning experiences for our students. This week, 60 of our students had the opportunity to take social action by working with Te Arawa Lakes Trust on their biosecurity work. They were also treated to a thrilling zip-lining experience on the same day!

Whai Men's Basketball Team Visit We were delighted to welcome members of the Whai Men's Basketball team, who visited our Middle School to share their experiences playing professional basketball in New Zealand. One of the players had even competed in the Olympic Games! Our students demonstrated our school value of *Curiosity*, eagerly asking insightful questions. The players were incredibly inspirational, and we thank Mrs. Mac for organising this special event. Additionally, all of our Middle School students received a complimentary pass to the Whai Fever vs. Otago Nuggets game on Wednesday, March 19th, at Unison Arena.

Waka Ama Experience Today, a group of 30 tamariki are exploring the sport of Waka Ama, learning the essential skills of teamwork, discipline, and timing to move a waka efficiently on the water. A big thank you to Liz Savage and Whaea Andrea for sharing their expertise and passion for Waka Ama with our tamariki.

Senior Student Hike at Lake Okāreka Tomorrow, a group of senior students will take part in a scenic hike around Lake Okāreka. This is a fantastic physical challenge, and what better way to accomplish it than having fun alongside friends!

Upcoming Event: RATS Duathlon Next week, 220 of our students will participate in the RATS Duathlon at Waipa. Congratulations to our tamariki and whānau for stepping up to take part in this incredible community event. We look forward to seeing everyone's happy faces as they run and ride the course! Thank you to Mrs Donovan for your hard work in pulling it all together for us.

Curriculum Development: Mathematics Our teachers are implementing the Ministry of Education's *Maths No Problem* resources across the school to complement our Math learning programmes at Lynmore. While we are still in the early stages, we are taking the time needed to teach the fundamentals of the Concrete, Pictorial, Abstract (CPA) Approach. This method, originally developed by American psychologist Jerome Bruner, is an integral part of the Singapore method of teaching maths for mastery. The CPA approach is designed to develop a deep and sustainable understanding of mathematical concepts in our students.

Senior School Extra Curricular Experience In just 10 days, our senior school students will embark on their adventure to Totara Springs for two nights! This experience is designed to ignite a growth mindset as students engage in various outdoor activities that encourage positive attitudes toward physical activity, safe risk-taking, team building, and self-reliance. Through this experience, our tamariki will:

- Apply *Aroha* by supporting and encouraging their peers.
- Show *Curiosity* by trying new activities.
- Display *Courage* when facing challenges that may involve risk or fear.
- Demonstrate *Integrity* by representing their best selves away from home and school.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

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We acknowledge that for some students and their parents, being away from home can be a source of anxiety. This is completely natural, and we want to reassure our whānau that our teachers and staff are committed to creating a supportive and nurturing environment for every child. This Extra Curricular Experience is a wonderful opportunity for tamariki to grow in confidence, independence, and resilience.

We encourage parents to support their children in taking this step, as we have seen time and time again the incredible benefits that come from these experiences.

We are excited about all the wonderful learning experiences happening in our school and look forward to sharing more updates soon!




