Our school was proud to have two teams compete in the recent Primary School Epro8 Engineering Competition, and they did an outstanding job!



Miss Watson noticed how supportive, kind and caring Tom was when a student was upset at community. Without being asked he made sure they were ok.



A big **thank you** to the parent helpers who joined us on the trip — we couldn't have done it without you.









Open to beginners aged 7 years and up. No device required, but recommended.




