Matariki Celebrations – Hautapu Ceremony

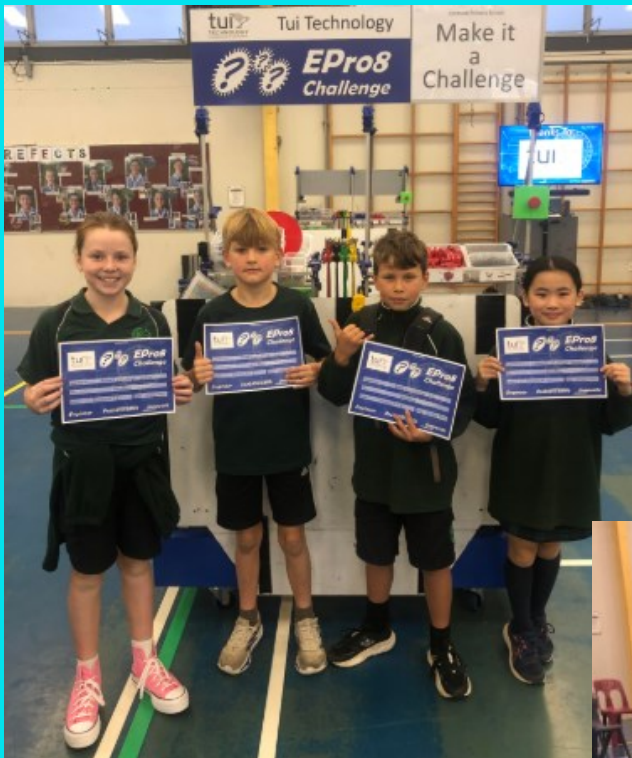
