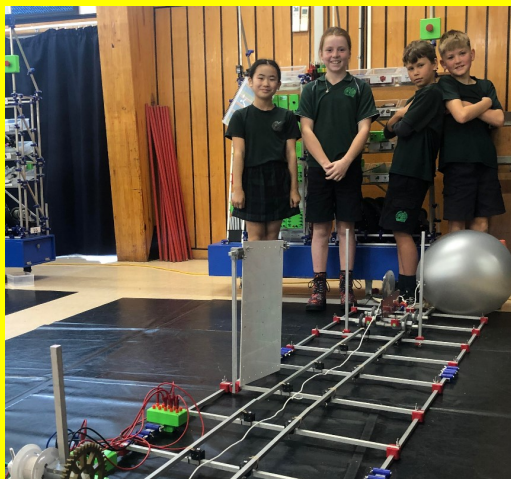

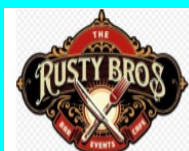

Then you'll see a timetable showing when your chosen teacher(s) are available. Simply click on the times that suit you.

When you have finished, your interview timetable will be emailed to you. And you can return to the site and enter the event code m4w3s again to change or cancel your interviews.

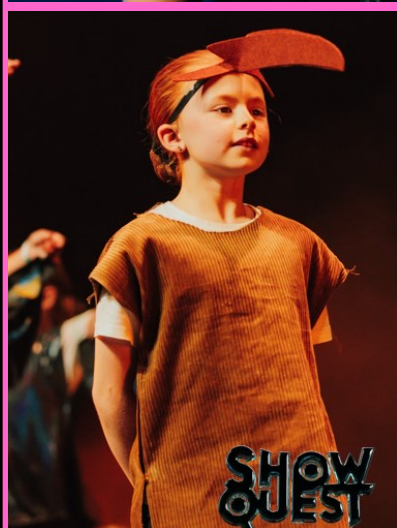
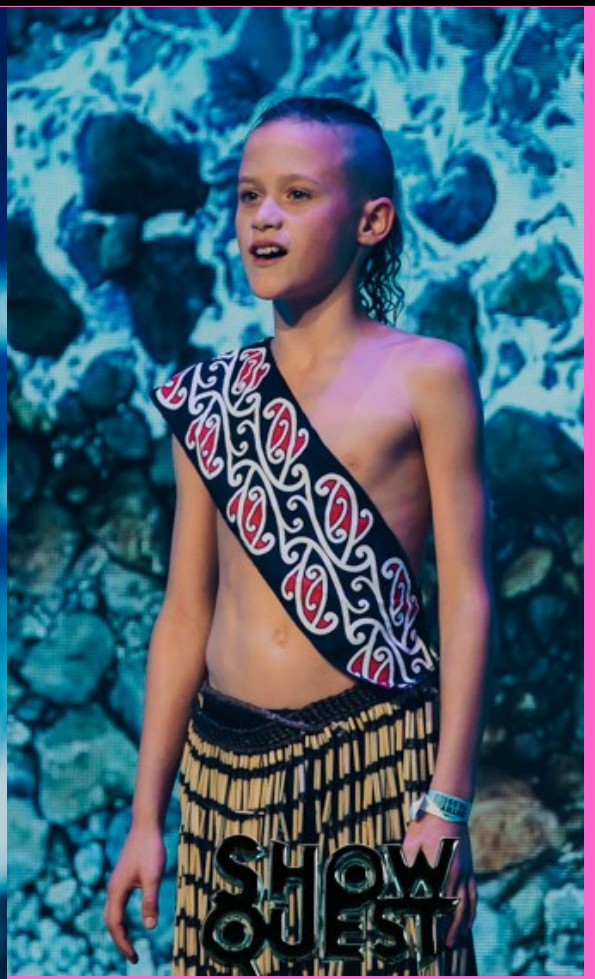

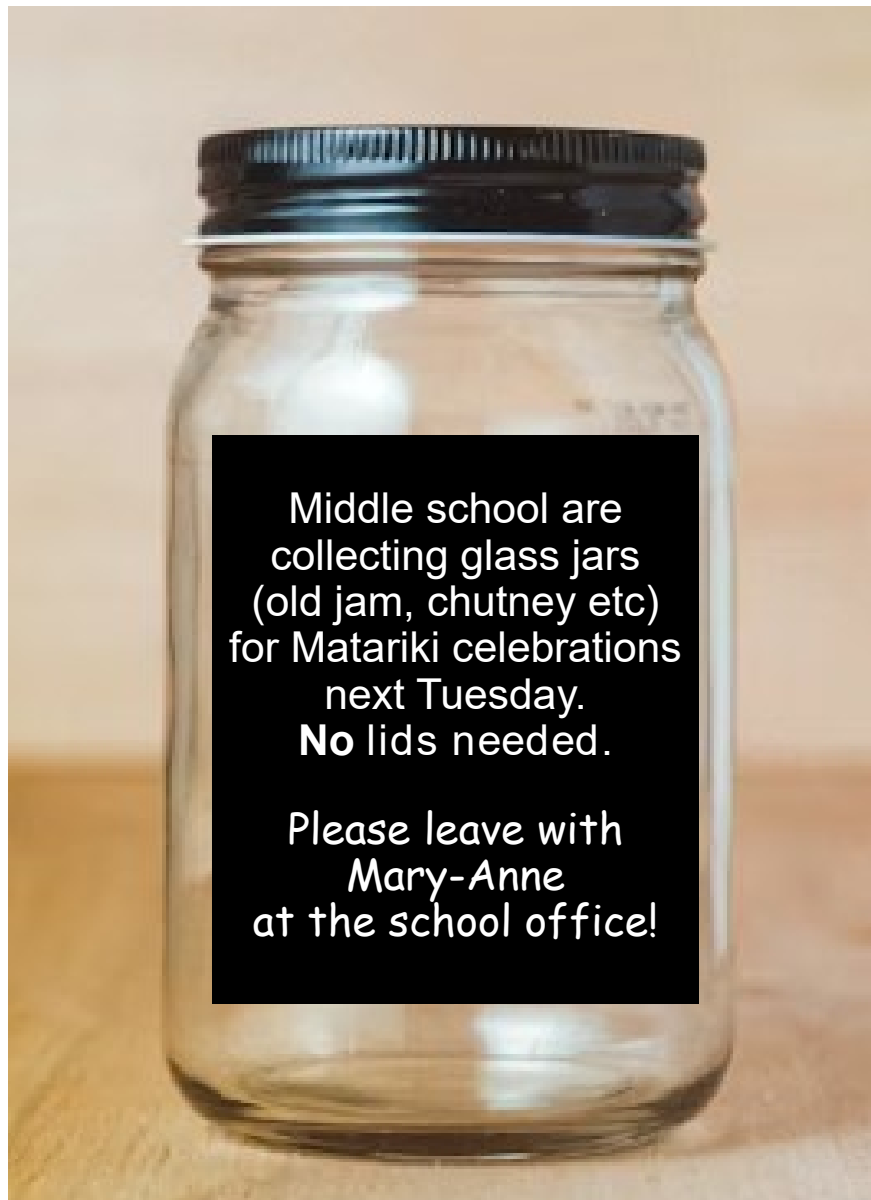


Ihenga 5 really enjoyed their time at the Rotorua Library and then at the Buried Village. They had lots to discuss and write about from their visit!
