#### Mānawatia a Matariki!

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We hope everyone was able to enjoy Matariki in a meaningful way. Our school Matariki celebrations were an example of our amazing staff creating a welcoming and totally-Lynmore School experience for our tamariki/children. We are so proud of our first hautapu ceremony. A massive ngā mihi/thank you to all our staff who braved the cold early morning start and to all our community who attended.

At our last Board hui/meeting we were shown reports about the activities happening at each cohort level - junior, middle and senior. And it's clear it's been a hugely busy term! Hopefully you all made a chance to check in with your child's kaiako/teacher at the PEP meetings this week and hear all about their amazing progress. The PEP meetings are so important as your involvement is key in your child's educational success.

We also received a comprehensive report about our English Language Learners (ELL) from our amazing ELL kaiako **Shadae Lemon.** It's so important that every child's culture is celebrated at our kura/school and we can see the passion that goes into making every ākonga/student achieve at their level while engaging with their heritage and background. What an awesome example of manaakitanga/support.

It was also time to view our mid-year academic statistics. We view our stats twice a year to ensure that every child is thriving. It's important to remember that the curriculum has recently been refreshed, meaning that the goal posts moved for our reports. Our kaiako have had to adapt to new learning progressions and then make overall teaching judgements to report against them. It's always challenging at year 3 and 5 when our children jump to a new area of the school and have to adjust to a new teacher and more advanced curriculum. If your tamariki are at those stages and you're concerned, hopefully your child's teacher reassured you at your PEP meeting.

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
