

TE PĀNUI O TE POARI / THE BOARD NOTICES

Kia ora tātou,

This is the final newsletter update from this Board, We ended up with only five parent nominations and as such, the new Board takes office seven days after the nominations officially closed, Thursday 14th August 2025. This Board met for the final time on Monday to ensure everything was ready to hand over. We also took the time to reflect on our key Board objectives set by the Ministry of Education and discussed if we thought we'd focused on the right areas during our three year term.

These objectives are:

- 1. Ensuring every student achieves their highest possible standard in educational achievement
- 2. Creating a safe and inclusive learning environment
- 3. Giving effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi
- 4. Ensuring the school is inclusive of students with differing needs

While we all agreed that these objectives are a continuous work in progress, we felt we had helped to guide the school in these key areas. We feel confident that the school is in a great place at the moment with excellent financial management, some key property projects completed others scheduled, and a continuous focus on refining policies, processes and reporting to continue focusing on these objectives.

The incoming Board will have some familiar faces: our mana whenua representative **Aneta Heke** continues in her role, **Karen Belt** continues as Staff Representative until the upcoming staff election is completed in September, **Daniel Gibbs** and **Sarah Jamieson** are returning and of course, **Hinei Taute** will continue to guide in her role as Principal.

Belinda Cridge steps down after three years on the Board. Both her children have left primary school and it's time for her to focus her energy elsewhere. Though her experience as a scientist will always be valued and you will no doubt see her around when she volunteers her knowledge to our tamariki. Belinda has a passion for safety and was a key person in reviewing policies and processes, particularly around safety of our tamariki on the roads.

TE PĀNUI O TE POARI CONTINUED

Hancine Samvelyan steps down after three terms (we think it might be about 8 years on the Lynmore Board!) and we want to acknowledge her massive efforts behind the scenes using her extensive governance knowledge. She was instrumental in leading process changes like moving our policy management to SchoolDocs which significantly improved our policy review process. She also led the Principal recruitment process, a lengthy and involved process which ended in the successful recruitment of our current Tumuaki / Principal. She was Chairperson (then Presiding Member when the terminology changed) for many years before handing the reins to Annamarie Jensen in 2023.

Annamarie also officially steps down after not standing for re-election, though she has offered her continued support to the incoming Board. With her son headed to Lakes High next year, she didn't want to stand in the way of parents with tamariki still at Lynmore School being on the Board. Annamarie (a self-confessed governance geek) led changes that may seem boring, like organising systems and annual workflows that streamlined the way we report. She also led our regular communication, changing the way we report to our parent and caregiver community. Annamarie wants to send a huge thank you to all the staff and students for making it worthwhile to continue in this role after her son left Lynmore School.

Hancine Samvelyan and Daniel Gibbs are standing for the Mokoia Intermediate Board and Annamarie Jensen is standing for the Lakes High Board. Both those schools are headed to election, so if you have a child at one of those schools, we can vouch for their governance skills! It would be great to have continued collaboration and support across our Eastside schools at Board level now that the government has cancelled funding for Kāhui Ako (which promoted this kind of engagement to the benefit of all our Eastside community). So if you're eligible, vote to keep experienced Board members in key roles in our community!

HARDBALL CRICKET Approximately Years 4-6 Thursday October 16th - December 18th 2025 COST: \$35 Payments are made direct to Northern District cricket. DO NOT make payments to Lynmore School.	Hardball cricket is played using wooden bats and protective gear (helmets, gloves, batting pads etc), as well as a hard cricket ball. It is suited for children approximately Years 4-6 who have already played Incrediball Cricket or who have well-developed hand-eye coordination. 
